## **Iatric Systems Public Health Immunizations and Public Health Reportable Labs Receive 2014 ONC HIT Certification**

Both are compliant with the ONC 2014 Edition criteria and are certified by the Certification Commission for Health Information Technology (CCHIT®), an ONC-ACB, in accordance with the applicable HOSPITAL certification criteria adopted by the Secretary of Health and Human Services. The ONC 2014 Edition criteria support both Stage 1 and 2 meaningful use measures required to qualify eligible providers and hospitals for funding under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA).
